
- Maintain Privacy Controls and Protect Personal Identifiable Information
 - The tech department asks that staff do not include any Personal Identifiable Information in their Prompts when using AI.
- Focus on using AI applications that support teaching and learning in a safe and thoughtful way.
 - Teachers are able to be more efficient with their time when developing lesson plans
- Continue to explore ways to support Inclusion by using AI
 - Reading texts can be differentiated for student reading levels
- Take an Ethical Approach
 - Be mindful of Stereotypes and Bias that may exist in Al generated text and images
- Promote the generation of Factual and Accurate Text
 - Al makes errors, so it is important to proofread and edit text created by Al.




